	 <u>Outdoor Kitchen:</u> two cook areas, half of the tables to be shifted to make undercover space. Need to concrete pads for oven and BBQ and under the seating moved out. May need further funds unless we know parents who may assist locally at cost or reduced rates.
	• BYOT: update use of devices 8 per class bring them in and allows our 15 we provide gives them good ipad access.
	• <u>Grounds:</u> concern the bottom flats are too muddy in winter months. Had to partition it off this week and a few times as the grass dies completely. Opened the Horse Paddock area. Need to reduce the trees height and shade on the bottom flat but cost is high.
	 <u>Parent on Line Payments</u>: going very well by all reports. Most have made the transition smoothly – EFTPOS ends this term.
	 <u>School E news</u>: good enrolment but not many are opening extra curricular and this section is for everything not associated with class and across the school. Need parents to redo their selections set up.
	 <u>Science Centre</u>: in old Music room – as we speak the room is taking shape. Music now based in the hall and science programs are printed and the equipment goes in this week.
	 <u>Ethics</u>: not enough trained teachers for program to meet our needs. As it is voluntary it means we have students on waiting list (max. 22 students in group)
	 <u>Kiama Community of Schools:</u> Education week celebration in the Park Thursday 31 July what do parents think and what should happen. Enrichment classes term 3
	 <u>Beautification of Quad A</u> (Infants): like to paint it and brighten it up if considered a priority for P&C as it may require a day of action. No progress
	 action. No progress. <u>L3:</u> will require extra funding for Year 1 if we want to continue down that path . School doesn't have extra funding so we may need to ask for assistance.
	 <u>Uniform Focus</u>: Black shoes black laces – no punishment just acknowledge those doing the right thing. Continues and seems to making an impact.

Treasurers report	 NEW: Interrelate: well done to all for the event that receipted \$2190. Brainstorm anti-bullying show: they have asked us to book for next year – funded by P&C at \$1700 free to all students. Do we want to continue in 2015? They are performing 11th Sept "magic Words". Playgroup: starts this Friday in quiet Room with Mrs Sheree Payne as coordinator. At that meeting we will set rules meeting times and establish what parents want. Community based so invited but targets the kinder 2015 enrolment parents. School Plan 2015-18: three years plan. Expectation is to have extensive consultation with parents. What do parents think should be the priority for KPS over the next 3 years. Students will be surveyed and parents with staff before we set out to publish a plan. Good Year for representation at all levels: swimming, athletics, cross country and soccer. Terrific results in individuals representing at school state level – rugby, skiing, equestrian. Debating, Public Speaking and chess most recently have stepped into the limelight as we have regional champions. May need to activate the policy of assistance to some (eg debaters won district and region is in Batemans Bay over two nights (cost \$190 per student, school also meeting teacher costs) \$27000 uncommitted funds – any suggestions for expenditure
	 welcome Chaplaincy program – continue to be paid this year. Governance given to P&C. Funding unavailable for 2015.
Canteen	Overuse of canteen by a small number of students – Lynne to let staff know of children that are purchasing with significant amounts of money or purchasing significant volumes of food (for multiple children).
