### P&C AGM Monday 26 March 2018

### Principals report 2017-18

I would like to thank the P&C on behalf of the staff and student body for all they do and have done to make our school the success it is. I regularly brag about the community support we have and that is largely due to this team's hard work.

2017 faced a new class and an expanding student numbers - at present we are 536 - that is an increase in 5 years by almost 200 students or almost 60%.

2017 was the year we welcomed a new play area - the King families drive in particular made it happen with support from P&C including Kaye and Fiona. The area has become a highlight of the school and the opening was very special. Great solution to increase play areas reduced by demountables.

The technology in our school blossomed under Lauren Purcell's skill and impassioned tutorage. The results where outstanding given a place in Education magazines top 40 schools nationally and the girls app team successes which continue even today as the Year 6 girls Buzz a Bully app is being considered by State department for ideas and the Year 4 girls app awarded NSW business award.. The 3 D printing went ahead in leaps and bounds so we have 7 available and readily accessed. The robotics teams are flourishing and the new coding groups are showing amazing potential.

Communication has been strengthened with the Expansion of our Facebook page again under Laurens leadership - the new P&C exec page is also beginning to take on momentum. The school now has many ways to communicate including e-school news app. Newsletter, website (undergoing new modelling) and individual class options like Dojo.

The canteen changes have been well received especially the new online orders and we recognise the efforts to make it happen. Lynne and Dani have made some significant changes in 2017 and on the whole it has been positive.

The P&C has affected change through sponsoring events like Happy Harold and the Brainstorm show. When parents raise issues and ideas we listen including the workshop on Online Bullying and the girls Flow program. This relationship has been working as we recognise needs and aim to meet increasing requests. NDIS has been difficult to facilitate as we have no space at times for providers.

SO what next - air conditioning and solar panels will be a major focus in 2018 but much of the preliminary work started in 2017. Klaas and Mrs Quill are moving ahead with this and the details are being tabled tonight.

The Rainforest garden project has also been considered and we hope to move forward with a school grant through Laurens Charity group and hopefully provide some funding

Boys education - needs to remain a focus. Ash and Kieren Corbyn have started Rock and Water with Stage 3 boys and Monty is planning Father and son event for later in the year.

### **Grants and Fundraising**

Major events this past year:

Opening of the New Adventure Eco playground with commitment to ongoing upkeep and associated costs.

Major Fundraising 2017:

The major fundraising/social event of 2017 was the Mother's Day Fashion Parade, with other minor fundraising continuing throughout the year - Mother's and Father's Day stalls, Lions BBQ at Black Beach, Kai Asian Restaurant Dinner, to name a few.

Social Events 2017:

Each year we start the school year with a Family Fun Night, a great evening to meet and socialise with teachers and other parents and families from our school community. It also provides a great opportunity for families to become familiar with the KPS grounds and some of the wonderful opportunities on offer.

We aim to have one major social event for parents each year, with additional social events throughout the year involving the KPS students. In 2017 we held the Mother's Day Fashion Parade for the mums, showcasing not only "pre-loved" wedding gowns but also highlighting some of our wonderful local businesses, providing a wonderful way to connect with the greater community. A Barefoot Bowls Day was held for the dads to celebrate Father's Day.

### Canteen 2017:

Throughout 2017 we have implemented regular meetings between the canteen staff, Lynne and Dani, and the two VP's. This open and regular communication has improved understanding between our canteen staff and P&C. The canteen staff are already undergoing revision of the menu to meet up and coming changes in guidelines and requirements, and we have investigated various ways of making their tasks and running of the canteen more efficient. Moving forward it has been proposed to form a canteen committee to keep this momentum happening. Also, it has been proposed that the exec meet to discuss canteen staff wages and hours, with considering the growth of school and profit of the canteen.

Future fundraising towards additional air-conditioning in buildings/classrooms at KPS - investigations and quotes continue to be carried out. In 2018 ideas for future fundraising include a Kiama Public School Ball held at the Kiama Pavillion, movie night and pizza day of the kids.

The beautification of the kindergarten area is underway with planning and a design to be delivered at the next GM. Students at KPS will be involved.

I would like to thank Christie Lewis for her co-operation and presentation of the records for audit. Her use and knowledge of the MYOB accounts provided an excellent audit trail.


