Business arising from previous meeting:

- Fundraising for 2016:
 - > Term 2- Movie Night: Friday 24th June.

- Dean is altering previous cake stall flyer, which will be in the next newsletter.
- Approval has been obtained and there will be 2 other fundraising groups also in attendance (sausage sizzle and raffle)
- Cake donations can be bought to the school office on the Friday.
- Serena, Jenny and Ingrid will assist with pricing items on Friday afternoon (before 3pm) and will load into cars from canteen to store at home.

Playground Planning

- ≥3 landscapers have now come to the site to quote. Waiting on other two quotes to come back in.
- ➤ Drawings will be sent to Assets Management before the holidays.
- ➤ Quote for 10m x 1m fibreglass slide has come in at \$4600. Waiting on delivery cost. Other options include shorter side by side slides (similar to Surf Beach Park) and two separate 5m 'wave' slides. Can also explore tunnel slide options.
- ➤ Kaye, Fiona, Angela and Siobhan will meet with Mr Honeywood, Mr Hall, Mrs Quill and Steve Lewis soon to look at slide in the shed, discuss quotes and consider ways area can be integrated with garden, reduce maintenance and use skills and labour of Year 6 alongside rainforest area clearing.
